1. Introduction

1.1 Background:

WWF-Hong Kong believes that weaving Education for Sustainable Development (ESD) as a thread from early learning stage to higher education institution will maximize its impact to achieve the sustainable future. Since 1983, WWF Hong Kong has been developing wide ranges of thematic learning *IN* the environmental education programmes to enrich learning experience for different audiences from the society. It is believed that increasing interflow among educators/ multipliers from the region in the field of nature conservation would result in strong big conservation impacts eventually.

1.2 What we offer:

Half day, single day or multi-days ESD training programme in Hong Kong. Workshop is designed according to the applicant group's needs.

1.3 Who can join:

Mainland/overseas multipliers who are: Managerial staff or front-line staff from nature reserves (or nature centres) who interests in initiating/ enhancing their ESD or/and public engagement programme; educators from overseas schools who would like to apply ESD work at their local network.

2.1 Theme:

- Various ESD approaches on Nature Conservation (Wetland and Marine themed), Ecological Footprint and/or Climate Change

2.2 Discussion topics and practical sessions:

- ◆ Overview and demonstration of WWF-Hong Kong ESD works
- ◆ Master-planning of a nature centre
- ◆ Development of an ESD master plan
- ◆ Development of an education programme (one-off and progressive approaches)
- ◆ Introduction of innovative education approach, e.g. Drama-in-education, e-learning
- ◆ Development of programme evaluation (Case study sharing)
- ◆ Operation of nature centre (e.g. resource management)

- ◆ WWF-Hong Kong education centres (Mai Po Nature Reserve, Hoi Ha Marine Life Centre, and Island House Conservations Studies Centre)
- ◆ Other nature centres in Hong Kong operated by government or non-government organizations

3.2 Basic charges of Workshop:

Half-day workshop - **HKD\$400** per head (minimum charge: HKD\$4,000 per workshop)

One day to Multi-days workshop - **HKD\$650** per head per day (minimum charge: HKD\$6,500 per day)

- Expenses of transportation between training venues, and lunches for participants during the training period are covered in the basic charges.
- The basic charges only cover expenditures under ordinary scenarios; final charges are subject to the confirmed content and itinerary of workshop.
- WWF will not provide overnight accommodation during the training workshop. Supports can be provided for applicants to look for suitable accommodation venue upon request.
